The Unbelievable God Season after Pentecost 2020

Dear Friends,

It's good to be home!

As an introduction to our Old Testament Scripture lesson today, I am grateful for this summary from the Rev. David Maxwell, editor for Westminster John Knox Press and *The Thoughtful Christian:*

The book of 1 Kings retells the history of Israel's demise to an audience of scattered, exiled, humiliated Jews. How did that happen to a nation that once occupied such a bright spot on the world's map? There are so many lessons to be learned from the events that led up to their destruction. Past leaders are largely blamed. The sordid stories of these corrupt political and religious leaders (with a smattering of good ones) remind listeners to question authority. As rumors of a return to Israel grow, the historical lessons from the book of Kings are clear:

--Center your life on the covenant established with God, not on blind obedience to a political or religious leader.

--Your God does not reflect a consumerist image, flashy as it may be, but is rather a moving force of justice love.

--God's still small voice is very much alive and moving through those attentive and courageous enough to follow, despite the overwhelming odds against the movement.

--God has not abandoned you, despite your current tragic situation.

--God will ultimately prevail.

I receive this as a good Word and wise counsel for many exiles scattered throughout the world today.

Come, let us worship in spirit and in truth!
