About today's service music: Chick Corea died Feb. 9 at the age of 79. He was an American composer, pianist, and 23-time Grammy Award winner. He recorded classical, jazz, Latin, and solo originals. He played with Miles Davis and Bela Fleck among many, many others over a 40+ year career. Corea was named a National Endowment for the Arts Jazz Master in 2006. This group of 20 "Children's Songs" was written and recorded in 1984, and I had the opportunity to learn and perform these two on my high school senior recital in 1996. I share them today with gratitude for the life and music of Chick Corea. --John Richardson



Return to the LORD, your God, for he is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love, and relents from punishing.

--Joel 2:13

Create in me a clean heart, O God, and put a new and right spirit within me. Do not cast me away from your presence, and do not take your holy spirit from me. *Restore* to me the joy of your salvation, and sustain in me a willing spirit. Then I will teach transgressors your ways, and sinners will *return* to you.

--Psalm 51:10-13

At a time when it is tempting to isolate our hearts as well as our bodies, how important it is to hear the Holy Spirit calling us back into relationship. During a season in which we have wrestled with our reality and grappled with our grief, where do we turn for hope? What are we to do with ourselves and with our situation?

The Word is *return*.

Return to God, who is gracious and merciful. Though our sins may distance us, God has a plan for our reunion. It is time for a new heart, a willing spirit, and thus, a new life altogether.

With its customary emphasis on truth-telling and self-examination, this season of Lent invites us to once again *return* to God in worship, in study, in service and sacrifice, in confession and in pardon. The message is clear and simple: when we *return* to God, we are *restored* by God.

Do not cast me away from your presence we pray.

I will not, says the Lord. I will not, I have not, and I shall not. I cannot return to you, however, because I never left you. Thus, for this relationship to be restored, you will need to return to me. That is the call. Return...and be restored...with joy!

We are glad that you have returned to worship with us today. Welcome home.

Five Means of Grace: Experience God's Love the Wesleyan Way by Elaine Heath

This six-week study is designed to help disciples discover the power of the five means of grace. John Wesley called these means of grace "instituted," meaning the spiritual practices Jesus himself participated in and encouraged his followers to do. For Wesley, these spiritual practices are seamlessly integrated with the practice of loving our neighbors well. A life of genuine prayer inevitably leads to a life of hospitality, mercy, and justice. Participants in this study will consider how the five means of grace are the ordinary channels that God uses to draw us into a fruitful relationship.

Weekly studies will focus on: Prayer, Searching the Scriptures, the Lord's Supper, Fasting, and Christian Conferencing. Classes begin February 24th. Cost of book: **\$10**


