## 2021 Summer Book Club

For this summer's fiction reading, we will look at the lives of women who take drastic measures to escape the lives that are before them. These authors reveal the different ways in which these women find opportunities to explore alternatives not necessarily presented to them by birth or circumstance or the choices they have made.



<u>The Invisible Life of Addie LaRue</u>, V.E. Schwab (June 15<sup>th</sup>, 5:30-6:30, Parlor) For Addie LaRue, the narrative spans several centuries, from 18<sup>th</sup> century France to present day New York City. Addie makes a Faustian deal in order to escape the fate her parents have laid before her and must live with the far-reaching consequences of the choice she has made.



<u>The Midnight Library</u>, Matt Haig (July 13<sup>th</sup>, 5:30-6:30, Parlor) Nora Seed makes a drastic decision to escape her life and then finds time standing still for her at midnight, but not really...as she "tries on" a number of different scenarios that could have been how her life played out.



<u>The Vanishing Half</u>, Britt Bennett (August 17<sup>th</sup>, 5:30-6:30, Parlor)

The Vignes twins dream of something more than what is before them in Mallard, LA, a small town of all light-skinned black residents, so they flee to New Orleans in search of something better. Our week of ROCKY RAILWAY VBS was absolutely amazing! I want to thank the 130 youth and adult volunteers who followed their hearts and made the commitment to serve! Because of you, 200 children learned that Jesus' power is at work in all life's circumstances. I'm confident that the children will remember what they learned each day!



Jesus' power helps us do hard things! Jesus' power gives up hope! Jesus' power helps us be bold! Jesus' power lets us live forever! Jesus' power helps us be good friends!

Each year at VBS, we offer the children the opportunity to make a difference by helping others. After all, that is what God calls us to do. During ROCKY RAILWAY, donations were brought in to support a few different organizations – Housing First, Baldwin County Child Advocacy Center and Baldwin County DHR. The money is being used to purchase items for hygiene kits for those without a home in Baldwin and Mobile Counties and fun summer activities to put in buckets for children in foster care. At the time this was written on Thursday, we had raised \$381.87. If you'd like to donate to our project as well, you can earmark it for VBS mission project.

I'd also like to thank Katja Palumbo and everyone that worked on the wonderful decorations throughout the CLC and Education Building! It took months of planning to get everything ready but in a few short days we were able to transform the buildings to look like we were in the Rocky Mountains. Did you know that when our VBS is over, we love to pass along our decorations to other churches? So far we know that Bay Minette UMC and Calvary Baptist in Foley will use them and then they will pass them on to others!

Our rising 5<sup>th</sup> & 6<sup>th</sup> graders participated in mission projects each day during VBS. Here's what they did this year: put together 500 hygiene kits, served in our Tough Dogs and Pups ministry making 40 chemo care bags, served at Prodisee Pantry, made and delivered 250 lunches to Fairhope city workers, put together 100 summer activity buckets for children in foster care and made 130 thank you bags for our VBS volunteers! I'm so proud of how hard they worked and the difference they made in our community.

Yes, it was indeed a wonderful, powerful five days! I give thanks and praise to God for all he did in us and through us! Thank you church family for all your support!
