Music Notes

This World Communion Sunday the service music is drawn from other cultures through our connections in the *United Methodist Hymnal* and hymnal supplement called *The Faith We Sing*.

Siyahamba (*The Faith We Sing*, 2235) is a South African freedom song that was disseminated to the Western world in the mid-1980s by Anders Nyberg (b. 1955) from the Church of Sweden Mission (Lutheran). Nyberg's collection, *Freedom is Coming: Songs of Protest and Praise from South Africa* (1984), included this hymn as well as "Freedom is Coming" (*The Faith We Sing*, 2192) and "Thuma Mina," or "Send Me, Lord" (*UM Hymnal*, 497).

Monseñor Cesáreo Gabaráin of Spain (1936-1991) was one of the best-known composers of Spanish liturgical music following the reforms of the Second Vatican Council (1962-1965). His hymns were recorded on 37 albums, and he is the only Roman Catholic composer to receive the honor of a Gold Record (at least 50,000 copies) in Spain. Four of his hymns are included in the *UM Hymnal*.
