Johann Pachelbel (1653-1706) was a great organist of the generation just before J.S. Bach (1685-1750). Pachelbel held the post of organist in Vienna, Stuttgart, and finally Nürnberg. One of his organ students was Johann Christoph Bach, J.S. Bach's older brother. Besides his famous *Canon in D*, Pachelbel also composed hundreds of chorale preludes like *All Glory Be to God on High*. This one is based on a hymn that would have been well known at the time; in German, it's called *Allein Gott in der Höh sie Ehr*. The text and tune were written by Nicolaus Decius around 1539. In English, the first verse has been translated this way:

All glory be to God on high, Who hath our race befriended! To us no harm shall now come nigh, The strife at last has ended. God showeth His good will to men, And peace shall reign on earth again; O thank Him for His goodness!
