Music Notes: Dietrich Buxtehude (1637-1707) was born in Helsingborg (at the time part of Denmark but now part of Sweden). He served as organist at St. Mary's Church in Lubeck in northern Germany from 1668 until his death. In 1673 he organized a series of evening musical performances called *Abendmusik*, which attracted musicians from diverse places and remained a feature of the church until 1810. Buxtehude became well known as a composer and musician during his lifetime; Handel visited him in 1703 and Bach in 1705, and his influence on both of them has been noted. Some of his best-known compositions are for the organ like the Toccata and the Fugue offered in the service today.






