#### **Local Mission Outreach**

- Family Promise- Our next host week will be October 24th. We are waiting to confirm if families will stay in the church or at the day center in Summerdale.
- **Community Cafe'** We serve over 200 meals each Friday to homebound and to-go. The Cafe' is currently closed, but we are monitoring Covid numbers with hopes to reopen soon.
- Local Mission Assistance- Over the last several months we have seen an increase in families and individuals needing emergency shelter or transportation. Local Missions continues to provide hotels room (extended stay) for families/individuals. Missions also provided gas cards, bus tickets, funds for power bills etc. Our Lord's Pantry (Caring Ministries) continues to also help so many of these families in need.
- Foster Care Outreach- Our church family continues to provide support to various children in Foster Care and those receiving on going services through DHR.
- Back to School Bash- Our annual Back to School Bash with Fairhope PD and area churches was held on July 31st. Over 500 sets of school uniforms for local families, foster care families and Baldwin County CareHouse. Backpacks were given by Fairhope PD. Other churches provided lunch, water and other supplies. We continue to work with local schools and DHR providing uniforms.

# **Upcoming Local Mission Opportunities:**

- KAIROS Prison Ministry- Recently we provided toiletry items (soap, toothpaste, toothbrush & deodorant) for the inmates at Fountain Prison in Atmore. Our plans are to provide these items regularly or as needed by Chaplin. We are also exploring other ways for us to be apart on this ongoing ministry for both the inmates and their families.
- Waterfront Rescue Mission- Sunday, September 19th we will be providing dinner at the Waterfront Rescue Mission. Our plans are to provide dinner at the mission at least once a month. Anyone interested in serving, please contact Jennifer Myrick or Carrie French.
- Thanksgiving Day Outreach- We will be providing our annual Community Thanksgiving Day Lunch. More information to come.
- Angel Tree Ecumenical Outreach- We will begin our Angel Tree Outreach the end of November. More details to come.

# Disaster Response

- **Disaster Response Teams (Sally)-** We continue to host work teams serving in our area with final Hurricane Sally projects. We hosted a few teams this past summer and have plans to host additional teams in October.
- Hurricane Ida Response-
  - Cook Teams- On Friday, September 10th our first cook team served Lineman working in Husser Community of the Tangipahoa Parish in Louisiana. Meals & Supplies were also distributed in the Ponchatoula community.

    We have plans to continue to provide cook teams in the coming days/weeks.

- Water/Supplies- We are working to collect supplies needed for our friends in LA. We are currently collecting cleaning buckets and other supplies needed. We will be sending supplies over to LA in the coming days. We will also be providing supplies to evacuees who are still sheltering in the Mobile area. More details to come.
- **ERT Teams-** We are working with our partners at the district and conference levels to send work teams into LA. Assessors are also needed to help survey damage and identify needs. More details to come.

#### International Mission Outreach

• **Costa Rica Missions-** We continue to be in close contact with our friends in Costa Rica. The pandemic has been extremely difficult on both ministries we serve. Both ministries continue to find ways to serve those in need with limited resources. The Methodist Children's Home continues to provide school on the property of the home. They recently opened the preschool in the multi-purpose building.

The Amor en la calle ministry continues to meet the needs of many throughout the entire country of Costa Rica. Due to the increase of Covid numbers over the past few months, we postponed our efforts to send a team this Fall. We are hopeful we may be able to send a team at Christmas or the beginning of 2022.

- Some Adult Sunday School classes have switched to Zoom only as COVID numbers have risen. Friends in Faith will resume meeting in-person Sunday, September 19<sup>th</sup>, and I think others will follow. The "3<sup>rd</sup> dose" of the vaccine may be giving people an increased feeling of protection.
- Sign-ups for fall classes have been slow and some of our offerings did not have enough
  participation to make the classes feasible. We are not sure if this is due to the current
  COVID surge or other factors. However, these classes will meet: Epic of Eden, Disciples'
  Path (Wednesday evening class), Disciple IV—Part 2, Pastor's Class—UMC 101, Book
  Study facilitated by Jen Galloway.
- And, my gratitude to Dr. Ann Pearson who will be leading a Bible study on Luke. There continues to be significant enthusiasm for anything Dr. Pearson offers!
- We postponed our Welcome Dinner (for visitors and new members) scheduled for September 1<sup>st</sup> due to COVID concerns. We will look at rescheduling this later in the fall, possibly in conjunction with one of our regular Wednesday night suppers.
- Our "Pathways" Assimilation Series was well-attended, with 26 people participating in one or more classes.
- Our "Summer Book Club" had good participation, bringing together people who enjoy reading secular novels and discussing them in community. Our average participation was around 20 people per book (3 sessions.)
- With this success in mind and in an effort to think "outside the box," we are investigating what interest-based community groups might look like as an additional approach to fostering adult community within our congregation.
