Dear Friends,

The season of Lent is upon us once again, and this year I am feeling an increased sense of urgency to 'get it right'. What that means, exactly, or how it is done is not always plain to us. What we do recognize, however, is that each year, Lent presents a new challenge—a certain call in the interest of new creation.

This year, your pastors are heeding the words of Paul in his correspondence with the church at Corinth: in Christ, God was (and is!) reconciling the world to himself, not counting their trespasses against them, and entrusting the message of reconciliation to us (2 Cor. 5:19).

This is a sacred honor...and a tremendous responsibility! Clearly, God was willing to do whatever it takes to reconcile with creation. He sent his only Son (Jn. 3:16)...and for our sake made him to be sin who knew no sin so that in him we might become the righteousness of God (2 Cor. 5:21).

If God is willing to do whatever it takes to reconcile with us, then what are we willing to do in response? Where do we start?

Each Sunday of Lent presents us with a special insight into the stages of the expedition that is the spiritual life.

March 1--In the Scripture for the first Sunday of Lent, we hear again the story of Jesus' temptation in the desert (Matt. 4). It reminds us not to be surprised at our own struggle with the will to have power, the desire for things, or the strange appeal of the morally injurious—all of which threaten to derail our giving ourselves to the things that really count in life. As Jesus triumphed over the seductions of the world and the limitations of being human, so must we.

March 8--The second Sunday, Jesus talks to Nicodemus about being born again. Without such an experience, he simply cannot see the kingdom of God (John 3:3). The new birth of water and the Spirit—life more abundant—is waiting to be lived.

March 15--The third Sunday, we see Jesus commission a Samaritan woman as an evangelist. Where do you get that living water? she asks (John 4:11). Like this woman at the well, we have some witnessing, some cleansing, and some extra work to do of our own in this life if we are to fulfill the gospel ourselves.

March 22--The fourth Sunday, Jesus heals a man born blind. Jesus invites us to open our eyes, too, to be willing to begin again, to forget the past—however bad it has been for us—and come back to God knowing that mercy is already ours. What would it take for your eyes to be opened (John 9:10)?

March 29--On the fifth Sunday of Lent, Jesus raises Lazarus. Can he who opened the eyes of the blind man keep this man from dying (John 11: 37)? The Word is clear: to follow Jesus is to live, no matter how many deaths we face in life.

Soon thereafter, the final stages in Jesus' journey will be a short distance away. But for now, you and I are not ready. We have some spiritual work to do before we can even consider the last leg of that journey. If Ash Wednesday is about opening our hearts in the hopes that it might be cleansed (Ps. 51), these Sundays are designed to serve as God's scrub brush and disinfectant.

Whatever it takes, Friends. Let's get it right. Be reconciled to God.

Dear Friends,

I was driving through downtown Fairhope Tuesday night before Ash Wednesday and felt a shift in the air. The festivities of Mardi Gras was over, and the streets were extra quiet. The journey through the wilderness begins today. Lent is here!

The forty days of our Lenten observance are often spoken of as an imitation, of sorts, of Jesus' forty-day wilderness experience after his baptism. In the isolating terror of the Palestinian desert, Jesus prepared himself spiritually for what he must endure when he arrives in Jerusalem. These temptations of Jesus invite us to move more deeply into the isolation and solitude of our own experience.

Jesus showed us that the key to resisting temptation is by finding our identity in our relationship with God. As we remember that in Baptism, God confers upon us our essential identity as beloved children, we may be less likely to succumb to the various pressures that seek to tempt and mislead us.

At the same time, it is also important to recognize that temptation is not a once and done. Jesus rejected the tempter here, but he had other moments of doubt, particularly at Gethsemane and the cross. Similarly, our life as Christians does not eliminate doubt, needs, or a sense of incompleteness.

All of us struggle with the powers of this world. All of us know, as Jesus knows, that it is often easier to choose power, violence, and domination instead of the reconciling ways of God. All of us know, as Jesus knows, that it is easier to pick up lifeless stones and hurl them toward one another instead of passing the bread that sustains life.

Friends, as you journey the next forty days through the wilderness, towards the crucifixion, you will be tempted. I encourage you to walk gently and with your heart wide open.

Whatever it takes...Be reconciled to God.

At our Ash Wednesday service, these words of invitation were shared as part of our liturgy:

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ:
the early Christians observed with great devotion
the days of our Lord's passion and resurrection, and it became
the custom of the Church that before the Easter celebration there
should be a forty-day season of spiritual preparation...
I invite you, therefore, in the name of the Church,
to observe a holy Lent:

by self-examination and repentance; by prayer, fasting, and self-denial.

We are now in that time of preparation leading up to Easter. We have invited you this year to participate in a small group study or community experience. Some of those have not yet begun and will extend into the Easter season, culminating later in April or May. Full information about each class and registration is available through our website.

In addition, we are inviting all small groups (short-term studies, Sunday school classes, Disciple Bible Studies) to participate as a group in a mission or outreach project together. Here are some suggestions for projects that may be meaningful...both for those who "give" and those who receive:

- Donate items for Military Care Packages
- Donate items for the Lord's Pantry
- Donate items for Tough Dogs Chemo Care Bags
- Work together to prepare a meal for Community Café
- Work together to prepare a meal for Manna on Wheels
- Plan afterschool snacks for the Rotary Youth Club
- Collect empty medicine bottles to give to Alabama Free Clinic in Robertsdale to be used for their patients. (Drug Companies provide the medicine but the medicine containers have to be bought. Empty medicine bottles can be brought to the church office.)
- Knit and Crochet Ministry provides many handmade items to our church ministries as well as our community and are in need of donations of yarn.
- Volunteer together at Prodisee Pantry
- Throw an appreciation party for our Preschool teachers
- Any other outreach project of your group's choosing!!

This prayer was prayed over the ashes you received:
Almighty God, you have created us out of the dust of the earth.
Grant that these ashes may be to us a sign of our mortality and penitence, so that we may remember that only by your gracious gift are we given everlasting life; through Jesus Christ our Savior. Amen.

As God has lavished more love upon us than we can possibly deserve or imagine, so may we reach out with gracious gifts of love to those around us!



MAKING THE CHOICE TO BE KIND

(An article from Group Publishing's Parenting Christian Kids)

The "Choose Kind" campaign is an outgrowth of the popular middle-grades novel *Wonder* by R.J. Palacio. The book addresses the tough topic of bullying, but the main message centers around the life-changing (and community-changing) power of kindness. Treating other people with courtesy, care, and respect isn't always our first instinct. But as followers of Jesus, we can look to him as an example of how to interact with other people - individuals created and loved by God.

Anti-bullying initiatives in schools are making some inroads at boosting kindness, yet most kids will deal with teasing and taunting at some point. Older children may be shunned from a group, known as relational bullying. Or they may face rude or even abusive behavior online, known as cyberbullying. By emphasizing kindness from an early age, parents raise children who know how to treat people well, tell right from wrong, and enlist help if problems arise. And by explaining the biblical basis for kindness, you let kids know the true reason - and source - behind such behavior.

Kindness is key, but it's just a start. *Galatians 5:22-23* lists eight other spiritual fruits that go hand-in-hand with kindness: love, joy, peace, patience, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control. Ask Jesus to lead you in how your family can sow, reap, and bear the fruit of kindness!

- 2. to remind your children to choose kindness in their thoughts, words, and deeds.
- 3. to help your family members put a stop to any bullying they may encounter.


Our Tough Dogs Cancer Ministry began in 2006 as a support group for persons or family members who are in a cancer journey. From this group there was a desire to offer more support thus the Chemo Care Bag Ministry evolved. These bags offer comfort and support to new cancer patients at Southern Cancer in Daphne and Foley, Mitchell Cancer in Fairhope and Mobile, and Infirmary Health in Fairhope. The bags are funded through donations, and a list of items needed are on the Fairhope UMC website. Gas cards are provided to the treatment facilities on an as needed basis for the clients. Recently the ministry has expanded to include Tough Pups bags for children ages 5-12. Bags are delivered each month to the Mitchell Cancer Center in Mobile.
